### From the Rector's Desk - November 2025

Dear Friends,

There is much to be grateful for as we head into the last months of 2025!

I have particularly been enjoying the programs we have been introducing for kids. It has been a joy to teach them about the seven days of Creation, reflecting on what it means that God made the whole world very good. The fact that our God became Incarnate for our sake is truly a miracle, because it means that he can accompany us on our long nights. I hope you can reflect on this miracle during times of both pain and health this season.

St. John's is a safe place for anybody who is grieving, even during this most wonderful time of year. It is also a place of immense joy! Everything belongs. If you have any pastoral concerns or issues, please let me know – we can have a cup of tea and talk.
